

1890: A Journal of Undergraduate Research Submission Guidelines

Interested in getting published? Want to promote your craft? Considering boosting your resume?

1890: A Journal of Undergraduate Research invites undergraduate students from all universities to submit their work—from any discipline—to be considered for publication in the journal's 2020 edition. The journal is interdisciplinary, meaning that research, scholarly articles, creative writing, artwork, and photography will all be placed under consideration. Deadlines:

Our submission deadline for the 2020 issue is **Friday, Nov 13, 2020**. As the journal is focused solely on the scholarship of undergraduate students, *1890* only accepts works from current undergraduate students, or those students who have recently graduated. To be eligible to submit work, students must submit their work within a year of receiving their first bachelor's degree.

Submission Policy:

Research, scholarly articles, writing, or artwork that has been published elsewhere—or are currently under review with another publication—are not eligible for review or publication with *1890*. By submitting work to the journal, the submitter guarantees that the copyright for the work is held by no other entity.

Submission Guidelines

Note: Your submission gives us permission to publish your work (if selected via the peer review process). You must contact us at 1890uco@gmail.com to retract your submission.

Authorship

The work must have been completed during the time that the student was enrolled as an undergraduate student, but work may be submitted for up to a year after graduating.

Submissions may have multiple student authors. Faculty co-authors may be considered, but *1890*'s primary focus is on student research. No more than one article per author will be published in a single section of a particular issue.

Formatting Guidelines

If interested in submitting your work, please review the complete submission guidelines below. Formatting for submissions will change depending on the discipline, so be sure that your work reflects the standard used for your discipline. Generally speaking, **MLA** is used in English and the humanities; **APA** is used in psychology and the social sciences; **Chicago/Turabian** is used

in business, history, fine arts, and some humanities; **CSE** is used in biology and other sciences; **IEEE** is used in many branches of engineering, computer science, and information technology.

We currently only accept works that are written in English.

Images—including tables and figures—should be included inside of the document itself. If the submission is accepted, authors may be contacted to submit separate image files. If the submission is simply an image, such as a work of art or photography, it is acceptable to send only the image file.

Quality of Writing

1890 does not currently have an expectation or limit for length. However, authors are expected to be as concise as possible with their writing.

Papers should be well-written in terms of the organization of ideas presented and in terms of grammatical and sentence-level construction. Authors are expected to pay close attention to grammar, language, and syntax. While our editors will work closely with authors to fix errors within the paper, papers may be turned away if the amount of errors could be seen as overwhelming for the editing team.

Ethics

A submission to *1890* implies that all authors—including co-authors—have read these guidelines and agreed to submitting the work. Additionally, it implies that:

- The submission does not infringe on any existing copyright
- The submission must not have been published in any other publication, in part or in whole, and is not currently under consideration by any other publication
- Any experimental research was performed with the approval of an appropriate ethics committee
- Research that was conducted on human subjects is in compliance with the Helinski Declaration
- Research that was conducted on animal subjects is in compliance with internationally recognized guidelines
